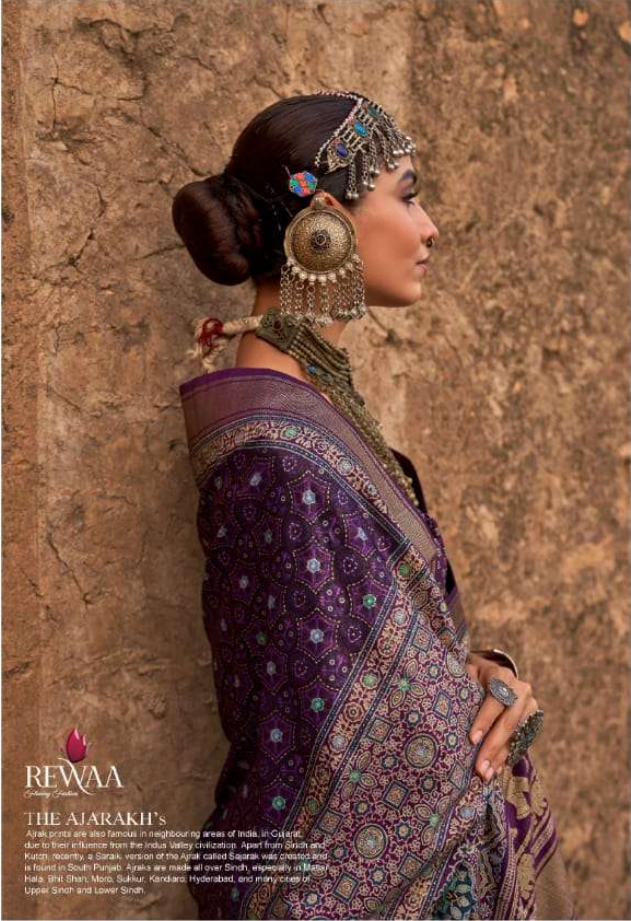
THE AJARAKH
